GUIDELINES

1. All entries of exhibits must be made on the official entry form which signifies acceptance of these guidelines and ought to reach the Show Secretary no later than **Monday 3rd October 2020.**

2. All entries must be staged by 11.00am (event judging time) on Saturday 8th October 2022. Exhibits must be placed in accordance with the Show Manager's instructions. Exhibitors will be given cards to identify them which are to be placed under the pots.

3. While every precaution will be taken, the event organisers will accept no liability for loss, theft or damage to plants or other property brought to the show.

4. There is no limit to the number of exhibits made by the exhibitor per class but only plants belonging to the Mesembryanthemaceae family are to be exhibited. **Please note that all exhibits shall be one plant per container except for class 24, 39 & 40 where multiple plants may be exhibited in a single container.**

5. Plant Sales: There will be a £5.00 charge for sales. Traders will be provided with necessary tabling.

JUDGING: All classes (bar class 41 & 42) will be judged in accordance with the "BCSS Handbook of Shows, 10th Edition" by the judge who requests that you keep clear of the area where judging is in progress.
